request that this matter be dismissed and all costs taxed to the Plaintiff. Additionally, Defendant requests such other and further relief to which she may be entitled under the law or in equity.

COUNTER-CLAIM

COMES NOW, Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff, Pamela Castle, by and through her counsel of record and hereby asserts her Counter-Claim for damages against the Plaintiff/Counter-Defendant, Candace Stewart Eubanks and in support thereof would show unto the Court as follows:

1.

The Plaintiff/Counter-Defendant, Candace Stewart Eubanks, is a resident of Forrest County, Mississippi as alleged in her Amended Complaint and may be served with process in this matter by serving her attorney of record, Phillip Londeree, Esquire at Londeree & Townsend, LLC, P. O. Box 445, Petal, Mississippi 39465 via electronic means or U. S. Mail.

2.

The Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff herein, Pamela Castle, is an adult resident citizen of Forrest County, Mississippi.

3.

The County Court of Forrest County, Mississippi, has jurisdiction over the parties to this matter and over the subject matter and venue is proper in this Court as both the Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff and Plaintiff/Counter-Defendant are residents of Forrest County, Mississippi.

The Amended Complaint which has been responded to herein, was filed against this Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff without substantial justification and with malice and for the sole purpose of harassment, threat and intimidation against this Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff. Accordingly, Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff asserts a Counter-Claim pursuant to \$11-55-5 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, known as the "Litigation Accountability Act" and would claim damages in the form of all defense costs and expenses incurred in defending the Amended Complaint in this action, if a voluntary dismissal is not immediately had following receipt of this responsive pleading and Counter-Claim by the Plaintiff/Counter-Defendant.

5.

In addition to the claims under the *Litigation Accountability Act*, the Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff herein is entitled to sanctions and damages against the Plaintiff/Counter-Defendant pursuant to Rule 11 of the Mississippi Rules of Civil Procedure.

6.

Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff would show that she has proof that the Plaintiff/Counter-Defendant surreptitiously, tortuously, by use of deception and intrusion, invaded the privacy of Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff herein by eavesdropping into a private automobile without prior consent and without being personally present. Such actions violate the federal "Wiretap Act" as codified at 18 USC 2511(2)(d). Additionally,

Plaintiff/Counter-Defendant violated Mississippi law as codified at §41-29-531(e) which requires prior consent of the party prior to recording any conversation.

7.

By her actions, Plaintiff/Counter-Defendant has invaded the reasonable expectation of privacy of the Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff herein and such invasion of privacy amounts to a tortuous intrusion against the Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff herein in violation of both federal and state law, giving rise to damages on behalf of this Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff and also subjecting the Plaintiff/Counter-Defendant to criminal violations of the law and in derogation of 18 USC 2511(2)(d) and §41-29-531(e) of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. Defendant demands damages for such violations and reference of proof of these violations to the appropriate authorities.

8.

By her intentional acts, the Defendant is guilty of the tort of trespass of a highly offensive nature to the Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff Pamela Castle and she would further show that the same conduct would be highly offensive to a reasonable person.

9.

In addition to the intentional conduct stated above, Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff would show that the Plaintiff/Counter-Defendant Candace Stewart Eubanks is guilty of extreme and outrageous conduct as defined by Mississippi law entitling this Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff to damages for severe emotional distress as well as physical sickness and inability to sleep.

Due to the intentional conduct stated above, Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff has incurred damages to be shown at a trial of this matter which have all been caused in fact directly from the conduct of the Plaintiff/Counter-Defendant Candace Stewart Eubanks.

11.

Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff herein seeks a judgment against the Plaintiff/Counter-Defendant in an amount sufficient to cover all defense costs, fees and expenses incurred by the Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff in defending the action filed against her by the Plaintiff/Counter-Defendant as well as all damages against Plaintiff/Counter-Defendant and her counsel as allowed by §11-55-5 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. Additionally, Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff requests damages which may be allowable under federal and state law for the unlawful wiretapping and invasion of privacy claims in an amount with the jurisdictional limits of this Court.

12.

Defendant/Counter-Plaintiff requests such other and further relief to which she may be entitled including but not limited to dismissal of the original Complaint and continued prosecution of the Counter-Claim as stated herein above.
